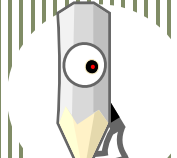
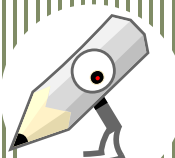
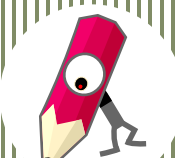
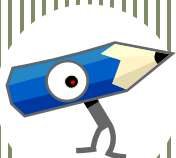
- Which of the two frogs acts correctly? Explain:

- Do the two frogs have the same freedom of choice?

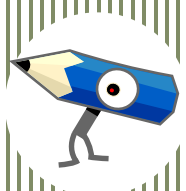
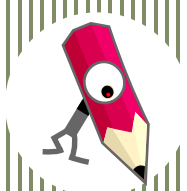
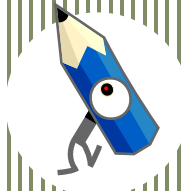
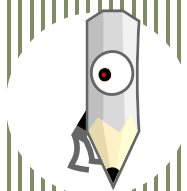
- Who is responsible for the decisions the frogs make?
