

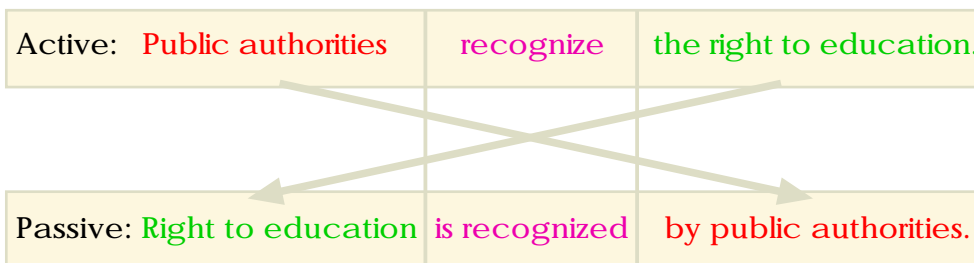


REMEMBER

The structure in a passive sentence is:

to be + past participle

When we have an active sentence, we can form the passive form by changing the object of the “active” sentence into the subject of the “passive” sentence, and the subject of the “active” sentence into the object of the “passive” sentence, or we leave it out.
